Re:	Safeguarding Children Resources and Policy			

As previously advised, from July 1st, 2022, legislative requirements for safeguarding children and young people (Child Safe Standards) are changing. This directly affects all sports, leagues, associations and clubs.

To support the transition to new Child Safe Standards AFL Victoria has been developing and delivering a range of educational assets to assist clubs and their volunteers in preparation for the pending changes with a series of online webinars and resources. The recorded webinars are designed to help clubs and their members understand what their responsibilities are in relation to safeguarding children and young people.

The Child Safe Standards place a clear legal duty on organisations to take steps to minimise the risk of child abuse, perpetrated by organisational representatives with onus being on the organisation to prove that it took reasonable precautions to safeguard children and young people.

To support clubs and association to understand their responsibilities, AFL Victoria are providing the attached:

- Templated Club Child Safety Policy for adoption. Whilst clubs and association may develop their own, adoption of the provided template is recommended.
- A one page, Child Safety Declaration which can be used to clearly articulate the policies and procedures which are applied in practice by clubs and associations.

The significant legislative change and requirement on clubs and association volunteers from July 1st has been broadly communicated however, it is appreciated that there will be some clubs unaware and therefore, AFL Victoria will run an awareness campaign over social media in the coming weeks which Leagues and Regions are encouraged to share to minimise risks of non-compliance.

It is requested that each League and Region please ensure that your respective clubs are aware of the impending changes and available assets. To support the messaging, we strongly recommend engaging the Volunteer Support Officer workforce who will play a critical role in communicating and supporting clubs becoming compliant with the legislative requirements.

In delivering an awareness campaign over the coming weeks, AFL Victoria have created social media assets which are attached and maybe used by Leagues and Regions or reshared from AFL Victoria platforms wherever deemed appropriate.
